MADISON — Today, the Joint Finance Committee (JFC) took action on multiple state agencies (DSPS, DOC, DOJ, DOA) that have immense impacts on state government operations and our state's workforce. JFC Democrats voted in favor of Governor Evers' plan to cultivate safe and healthy communities that will support working families in our state.

The Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) has successfully addressed licensing backlogs with the help of Governor Evers' allocation of federal funds for additional staff positions. Today, Republicans on JFC introduced a plan that would significantly decrease staff from current levels, once again forcing our state agencies to do more with less.

After today's executive session, the Democratic members of the Joint Finance Committee issued the following statement:
