Rep. Plumer's End of Session Recap

MADISON, WI – Last week, Assembly Republicans concluded our legislative session for 2023-2024.

This session, Rep. Plumer authored legislation that increases funding for Holocaust education, licensure of dental therapists, extending the timeframe for farm service driver's licenses, regulating construction crane easements, and making the Brandy Old Fashioned the Wisconsin state cocktail. In addition, he co-authored a bill regarding the disbursement of utility aid payments for power plants, a critical piece of legislation that would directly impact the residents of Columbia County and the Town of Pacific.

"I am proud to have authored various pieces of legislation this session that will keep our state moving in the right direction," said Rep. Plumer. "We have made great strides in the areas that matter most to Wisconsinites."

In addition to the Representative's policy work, Assembly Republicans advanced landmark legislation on numerous topics, including a tax cut package, increasing the local shared revenue program, investing in education; and so much more.
