## **Rep. Rob Brooks Commences Fall Session with Votes to Strengthen Wisconsin Families**

**Madison, WI**—Representative Rob Brooks (R-Saukville) is proud to have supported legislation that will have a positive impact on Wisconsin families. In the first floor day of the Wisconsin State Assembly’s fall legislative session, lawmakers approved several legislative proposals that will increase access to health care and update our state’s adoption laws, both of which passed with overwhelmingly bipartisan support.

“I came to Madison to make a difference in the lives of my constituents and be their voice on issues in the state legislature,” said Representative Rob Brooks. “Yesterday we approved legislation that will bring better medical care to families and strengthen Wisconsin’s adoption statutes,” Representative Rob Brooks said.

“I joined my colleagues yesterday in support of AB 310, a bill that removed \$3.5 million in federal funding for Planned Parenthood. Vital women’s health services should be offered by providers devoid of ties to groups that perform abortions,” said Representative Rob Brooks.

Assembly Bill 253 allows Wisconsin to join an Interstate Medical Licensure Compact and streamlines the process for doctors to practice in multiple states. This legislation increases access to medical care, especially in rural areas, as it further facilitates the use of telemedicine.

Other legislative priorities this fall include tackling public benefit fraud, approving additional measures to fight opiate and heroin addiction, and making government work more efficient for you, the constituents of Wisconsin’s sixtieth district. Three task forces have been developed to address the issues of Alzheimer’s and dementia, youth workforce readiness and urban education.

“After having spent the past few months in the district listening to constituents and attending countless community events, I am excited to get back to working on legislation to make Wisconsin an even better place to live, work and play,” said Representative Rob Brooks.
