Rep. Doyle Cosponsors Bill to Ban Robo-Calls

MADISON - We all hate those annoying political calls with a recording on the other end. "Robo-calls," as they are known, are rude and impersonal and they always call right when you are sitting down to a nice family dinner. During this last election cycle, I talked with constituents who told me that they often received 10 of these calls a day, sometimes from the same candidate. It got so bad that some people stopped answering their phones whenever a strange number came up until after the election. For years Wisconsin has had a comprehensive "No Call List" that protects citizens from receiving unwanted telemarketing calls. Now it's time to do something about the political calls.

That's why I am now cosponsoring a bill that would prohibit robo-calling for political messages. This proposal, currently called LRB-0985/1, would prohibit the use of automatic telephone dialing devices for the purpose of getting you to support or oppose a political candidate, party or campaign. If this bill passes, every call you receive from a campaign will have a real-live person on the other end, not just a recording. We can't stop all calls, but at least you will have someone to whom you can express your thoughts or frustrations.

Unlike most other states, Wisconsin currently has no laws restricting robo-calling. Now the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) will be able to investigate and, if necessary, enforce penalties against any violations of this law.
