ASSEMBLY PASSES REP. DOYLES' BILL

Today the Wisconsin State Assembly passed Senate Bill 266, which was introduced by Rep. Doyle. Currently in Wisconsin, when a law enforcement officer dies in the line of duty, his or her family is notified a few days later that their health insurance has been terminated. Under this bill, families will no longer receive that call and have to worry about losing their healthcare. Representative Doyle had the following to say:

“I am honored my colleagues in the Assembly joined me today and unanimously voted to advance my bill to ensure we provide the respect and financial resources grieving families deserve. The brave men and women leave home in the morning and have no control over whether or not they make it home for dinner. Should the unthinkable happen and one of those officers do not make it home, it is my duty to make sure the family continues to receive the healthcare they need.”

Senate Bill 266 has passed both houses and will now be making its way to Governor Tony Evers' desk. Based on the quick legislative action and bipartisan support, this bill should have no issues getting signed into law.
