

7th Annual Joan Ballweg Leadership Scholarship Summary

Area of Study: General

Description: The Joan Ballweg Leadership Scholarship was established in April 2005, and will continue as long as I am an elected representative. The purpose is to encourage and reward students who have taken a role in leadership during their high school years. Hopefully you will continue your leadership roles in college, and after you graduate. Your leadership skills will be valuable to your employer in the workplace and the community where you live.

Requirements: All graduating seniors continuing their education in a 2-year Technical College program or a 4-year baccalaureate degree program are eligible. Students must be graduating with at least a 3.0 average on a 4.0 point scale and must reside in the 41st Assembly District of the Wisconsin State Legislature. They must demonstrate leadership by participation in groups and organizations as officers, captains or other roles of authority.

Examples of groups or activities include: Student council, class officer, officer of student organizations such as NHS or FFA, captains of teams, whether athletic or academic, student directors for music or drama, positions in organizations outside of school such as 4H, church groups, volunteer organizations or non- school athletics, music and arts or academic competitions.

Amount: Up to five, \$500 scholarships will be awarded, based on the quality and quantity of applicants.

A minimum of one letter or recommendation is necessary, but no more than two will be accepted.

Candidates must be residents of the 41st State Assembly District at the time of high school graduation. Wisconsin State Assembly District 41 covers the following:

-The entirety of **Green Lake County**

-Areas of **Fond du Lac County**: the city of Ripon, the villages of Brandon, Fairwater, and the towns of Alto, Metomen and Ripon.

-Areas of **Marquette County**: the village of Neshkoro, towns of Neshkoro, Crystal Lake, Newton and Mecan.

-Areas of **Waupaca County**: the village and town of Fremont

-Areas of **Waushara County**: the city of Wautoma; the villages of Redgranite, Lohrville, Wild Rose, and Coloma; and the towns of Aurora, Bloomfield, Coloma, Richfield, Marion, Dakota, Wautoma, Mt. Morris, Saxeville, Springwater, Leon, Warren, and Poysippi.
