

## 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Joan Ballweg Leadership Scholarship Summary

**Area of Study:** General

**Description:** The Joan Ballweg Leadership Scholarship was established in April 2005, and will continue as long as I am an elected representative. The purpose is to encourage and reward students who have taken a role in leadership during their high school years. Hopefully you will continue your leadership roles in college, and after you graduate. Your leadership skills will be valuable to your employer in the workplace and the community where you live.

**Requirements:** All graduating seniors continuing their education in a 2-year Technical College program or a 4-year baccalaureate degree program are eligible. Students must be graduating with at least a 3.0 average on a 4.0 point scale and must reside in the 41<sup>st</sup> Assembly District of the Wisconsin State Legislature. They must demonstrate leadership by participation in groups and organizations as officers, captains or other roles of authority.

Examples of groups or activities include: student council; class officer; officer of student organizations such as NHS or FFA; captains of teams (athletic or academic); student directors for music or drama; positions in organizations outside of school such as 4H, church groups, volunteer organizations or non- school athletics; music, art or academic competitions.

**Amount:** Up to five, \$500 scholarships will be awarded, based on the quality and quantity of applicants.

A minimum of one letter of recommendation is necessary, but no more than two will be accepted.

Candidates must be or have been a resident of the 41<sup>st</sup> State Assembly District during their senior year.

**Wisconsin State Assembly District 41** covers the following:

- Areas of **Adams County**: Towns of Adams, Dell Prairie, Easton, Jackson, Lincoln, New Chester, New Haven, Quincy, and Springville; Village of Friendship; City of Adams and the City of Wisconsin Dells located in the county.

-**Columbia County**: The City of Wisconsin Dells located in the county.

-Areas of **Fond du Lac County**: Town of Ripon, and City of Ripon.

- Areas of **Green Lake County**: Towns of Berlin, Brooklyn, Green Lake, Mackford, Marquette, Princeton, Seneca and St. Marie; Village of Marquette; Cities of Green Lake, Markesan, and Princeton; and the City of Berlin located in the county.

-**Juneau County**: The City of Wisconsin Dells located in the county

-Areas of **Marquette County**: Towns of Crystal Lake, Harris, Mecan, Montello, Neshkoro, Newton, Oxford, Packwaukee, Shields, Springfield, and Westfield; Villages of Neshkoro, Oxford, and Westfield; City of Montello.

-Areas of **Sauk County**: Village of Lake Delton, and the City of Wisconsin Dells located in the county.

-**Waushara County**: The City of Berlin located in the county.
