



Emergency Medical Services Runs with Naloxone Administration by Patient County of Residence, Wisconsin, 2015

- These figures reflect the number of ambulance runs with a naloxone administration, not the total number of naloxone administrations; naloxone may be administered more than once per ambulance run.
- Naloxone may be given to an unresponsive person when it is unclear whether the event was opioid overdose-related; these figures include all runs during which naloxone was administered.
- Naloxone administration rates may vary due to differences in EMS policies, programs, and practices.
- EMS data do not specify what opioid(s) might have been taken.
- These data do not include law enforcement or other non-EMS naloxone usage.
