PRELIMINARY DRAFT - NOT READY FOR INTRODUCTION

1 AN ACT **relating to:** study of the requirements for certain credentials for providing substance use disorder treatment.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This is a preliminary draft. An analysis will be provided in a subsequent version of this draft.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions.

- (1) DEFINITION. In this section, "department" means the department of safety and professional services.
- (2) Study. The department shall conduct a study of the requirements for obtaining a credential as a substance abuse counselor, marriage and family therapist, professional counselor, or social worker. In conducting the study, the department shall consult with the marriage and family therapy, professional

counseling, and social work examining board, the department of health services, any other state agency having a purpose related to substance use disorder treatment, and an organization with knowledge and expertise in the requirements for obtaining credentials to provide substance use disorder treatment in other jurisdictions. Not later than December 31, 2018, the department shall submit a report of its findings to the legislature under section 13.172 (2) of the statutes. The report shall include proposed changes to statutes and administrative rules based on all of the following:

- (a) The department's comparison of current requirements in this state for obtaining a credential as a substance abuse counselor, marriage and family therapist, professional counselor, or social worker, including requirements for supervisory positions, with the requirements for obtaining similar credentials in other jurisdictions, and with current research on recommended requirements and qualifications for persons providing treatment of substance use disorders.
- (b) The department's assessment of whether the requirements compared in paragraph (a) are substantially equivalent, and of whether it is possible to expedite the granting of reciprocal credentials to practitioners possessing credentials from other jurisdictions having substantially equivalent credentialing requirements.
- (c) The department's assessment of whether education, training, and experience obtained for satisfying the requirements for a credential as a marriage and family therapist, professional counselor, or social worker should be counted towards satisfying the current requirements for obtaining a certification as a substance abuse counselor.

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(d) The department's review of the addiction counseling competencies of the substance abuse and mental health services administration of the federal department of health and human services and of evidence-based practices published by national organizations having a purpose involving the training or licensure of substance use disorder treatment providers.
