Wisconsin Examiner - Senate GOP Passes Tax Cut, Abortion Bills, and Transgender

<u>Restrictions in Contentious Floor Session</u> The Wisconsin Senate's Republican majority passed their rewrite Tuesday of workforce legislation that Governor Evers proposed in August, leaving nothing of Evers' original bill and guaranteeing its eventual veto.

AP – <u>Wisconsin Senate Gives Final Approval to Bill Banning Gender- Affirming Surgery</u> Gender-affirming surgery for minors would be banned in Wisconsin under a Republicansponsored bill that won final approval in the GOP-controlled legislature on Tuesday. [...] Republican supporters have suggested that the opinions of medical experts will change on the importance of gender-affirming care, though it has been available in the United States for more than a decade and is endorsed by major medical associations.
