SUBJECT: All Wisconsin Laws Enacted as Part of an Extraordinary Session

Per your request, this memo contains all of the Wisconsin laws that have ever been enacted as part of an extraordinary session. This list also includes all joint resolutions adopted during an extraordinary session that proposed amending the constitution. Note that the legislature first adopted a joint rule permitting extraordinary session calls during the 1977 session and the first extraordinary session occurred in January of 1980.
