Dear Secretary Smith:

We write to express our deep disappointment in your decision to not pursue or support several federal health grants this year that would have helped fight drug and alcohol abuse and expanded health care access in Wisconsin. We strongly urge you to apply for or support similar federal prevention and health care access grants in the future, as the application deadlines for the grants mentioned below have already passed.

Wisconsin has earned the dubious distinction of having the highest rates of drunken driving and binge drinking in the nation. Nevertheless, you still decided not to apply for two federal health grants totaling \$8.6 million over the next five years to fight substance abuse in Wisconsin, according to a recent report by the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel. One of these grants, the Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) grant, would have helped expand delivery of substance abuse intervention services in primary care and other health care settings in Wisconsin. This grant would have continued the state's original five-year grant. That grant laid the groundwork for the state's ongoing alcohol and drug screening, intervention and treatment referral services. The other grant, the Strategic Prevention Framework State Prevention Enhancement Grant, would have enhanced Wisconsin's substance abuse prevention infrastructure, improving state prevention service systems and identifying gaps in service.

In addition to asking you to support programs that help prevent and expand treatment for substance abuse, we encourage you to do everything in your power to make health care accessible and affordable for all Wisconsin residents. We were disappointed by your decision in April to decline to support an application by ABC for Health to renew its federal grant for enrolling eligible people for BadgerCare Plus, according to the same news report mentioned above. Your decision to not support the important and necessary work of a nonprofit public interest advocate like ABC for Health appears to be unprecedented. Similar requests for federal health funding have consistently been supported in the past by Republican and Democratic administrations alike.

Again, we are troubled by your decision to not pursue or support federal health grants that would have funded services dedicated to addressing Wisconsin's substance abuse problems and expanding access to affordable health care. We strongly urge you to aggressively pursue federal health funding for Wisconsin in the future.
