Call to Order

Co-Chair Grothman called the meeting to order. The roll was called and a quorum was present.

Introduction of LRB-2825/1 and LRB-3580/1 (Revisor's Correction Bills)

Bruce Munson, Revisor of Statutes, explained the Revisor's correction bills, LRB-2825/1 and LRB-3580/1.

Senator Grothman moved, seconded by Representative Hubler, that the Law Revision Committee introduce LRB-2825/1 and LRB-3580/1. The motion passed on a unanimous voice vote.

Review and Introduction of Proposed State Agency Remedial Legislation

Remedial legislation proposals were considered for the following state agencies: the Department of Natural Resources, University of Wisconsin System, and the Department of Health and Family Services. The attached chart indicates the Legislative Reference Bureau drafts that were approved for introduction as remedial legislation by the Law Revision Committee.

Due to time constraints, the committee did not consider one of the proposals from the Department of Health and Family Services. This proposal may be taken up at the next meeting.
