LRB-0952/1 and LRB-2304/1 (Revisor's Revision Bills)**

Bruce Munson, Revisor of Statutes, explained two Revisor's correction bills, LRB-01443/1 and LRB-2183/1, and two Revisor's revision bills, LRB-0952/1 and LRB-2304/1.

Representative Hubler moved, seconded by Representative Suder, that the Law Revision Committee introduce LRB-0952/1, LRB-1443/1, LRB-2183/1, and LRB-2304/1. The motion passed on a vote of Ayes, 6; Noes, 0.

Review and Introduction of Proposed State Agency Remedial Legislation

Remedial legislation proposals were considered for the following state agencies: Department of Military Affairs; Department of Public Instruction; Department of Revenue; Ethics Board; Office of State Employment Relations; and Office of State Treasurer.
