pt.2: *Knowledge, Beliefs, and Social Influences.* Suggests usage has declined because of changes in social attitudes.

pt.3: *Environmental Tobacco Smoke, Cessation, Counter-Marketing, School Programs and Enforcement.* Emphasis on school antismoking campaigns and enforcement of laws restricting youth usage.

Wisconsin Youth Tobacco Survey 2001. Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services, Bureau of Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, 2002. (178.9/W7j1) Measures usage of tobacco by Wisconsin youth in 2000-2001, by a survey of 49 randomly-selected middle schools. Fourth report of the Wisconsin Youth Tobacco Survey.

Describes the ads before and after the 1998 tobacco settlement agreement by the 3 largest tobacco companies and documents their violations of the agreement.
