Senate Committees Hear Testimony on SB 569, 570, 697 and SJR 75 *Stroebel: Bills Represent Common Sense Reforms and Good Government*

Madison, WI – Today Senator Duey Stroebel (R-Cedarburg) testified in support of four important reforms - Senate Bills 697, 569, 570 and Senate Joint Resolution 75. In addition, Sen. Stroebel's Government Operations and Consumer Protection committee heard testimony from Cooper School students on SB 600, a bill to make bicycling the state exercise.

SB 697 represents an important consumer protection measure to secure and protect data located in a vehicle's event data recorder.

SB 569 and 570 are bills requested by the Department of Administration that will modernize and provide consistency in statutory language regarding the filing of municipal records and will eliminate a burdensome mandate on many Wisconsin government agencies.

Senate Joint Resolution 75 would present Wisconsin voters with the option to amend the constitution to limit legislative terms to 12 years in each house and eight years in the office of Governor and Lieutenant Governor.

"I was proud to testify today in support of four common sense reforms," said Sen. Stroebel. "Protecting the private data located within a vehicle's event data recorder represents an important consumer protection. The data remains accessible; an entity which seeks the data must simply obtain the vehicle owner's consent. Senate Bills 569 and 570 are good government reforms that modernize municipal filings and eliminates unnecessary mandates on Wisconsin government agencies. Joint Resolution 75 limits years of legislative service to 24 years, a standard that would be the most liberal term limit in the country and a policy that by most accounts generates 75% public support. Finally, I was happy to provide MPS students with the opportunity to participate in the legislative process by testifying in favor of a pro-bicycling bill."

Senator Stroebel represents the 20th Senate District which includes parts of Ozaukee, Washington, Fond du Lac, Calumet and Sheboygan Counties. He lives in Cedarburg with his wife Laura and eight children.
