


Dear Secretary Cole,

- Will be the first farm in America to achieve water stewardship certification.
- 1,800 Cows | 4,800 Acres
- Converting marginal land back to wetlands and pollinator habitat.
- Reducing wash water by 15 gallons/day per head, for average water savings of 16 million gallons/year.
- Cover cropping, manure injection, no-tillage practices.
- Engaging community members.

## **Steps to Certification**

- Recruitment in Clear Water Farms
- Working with CWF and AWS to complete assessments, make adjustments, & prepare documentation for certification
- Formal certification by independent auditor
- Communication and education of other producers







#### **Our Solution**

River Alliance is asking the State to match farmers' investment in this homegrown effort.

- Farmers are matching up to 10K in time invested.
- Scale to 20 participating farms.
- 200-250K for training and cost of audit.
