This legislation is part of a broader package of bills recommended by the Speaker's Task Force on Suicide Prevention. This bipartisan task force was created in March of 2019 and held six public hearings across the state with the charge of evaluating the current resources for suicide prevention and identifying opportunities to target and assist at-risk individuals.

The Task Force <u>hearing in Marshfield</u> focused on farmer's mental health. This bill creates an appropriation through DATCP to make farmer tuition assistance grants. These grants can be used to complete courses at a technical college that pertain to farm and business management techniques. Several technical colleges across Wisconsin offer Farm Business and Production Management courses that would be eligible for these tuition assistance grants.

Increasing the availability of this program is crucial to both beginning and established farmers. The community environment that is created when farmers gather together allows them to foster support from each other, and realize that others are facing the same issues as them. The testimony given from <u>Professor John Shutske a UW Extension specialist</u>, at the Marshfield hearing, states that a suicide concern in farmers is disconnecting from their support system. Expanding the reach and accessibility of this program will allow farmers to build a community while learning.
