A Bright New Day in Wisconsin New Year, New Maps, New Legislative Session

MADISON—Today, Representative Robyn Vining (D-Wauwatosa) will be sworn in and begin her fourth term in the Wisconsin State Assembly, representing the 13th Assembly District, a redrawn district that now includes Elm Grove, and parts of Wauwatosa and Brookfield. Rep. Vining has spent the last six years in the legislature focused on healthcare, mental health, infant and maternal health, funding for our public schools, a fair and healthy democracy, the needs of small businesses, and more. As the legislative session begins, Rep. Robyn Vining released the following statement:

“It is a bright new day in Wisconsin—new maps have brought a new balance to the legislature, and refreshed our Democracy to better serve the Wisconsin people. We begin this legislative session with hope, optimism, and an enthusiastic energy to find common ground for the common good.
