

Wisconsin's Climate and Jobs Package Framework

EMISSIONS REDUCTION TARGETS

Codifying emissions reduction targets to ensure that Wisconsin is compliant with the Paris Climate Accords

Strongest Emission Reduction Targets in the Upper Midwest:

- 1. Wisconsin must be operating at 60% of 1990's greenhouse gas emission levels by 2030
- 2. Wisconsin must be operating at 15% of 1990's greenhouse gas emission levels by 2050

Community Air Monitoring and Emissions Reduction Program

Preparing a community air monitoring program to identify locations in disadvantaged communities across Wisconsin that are experiencing the most adverse effects from air pollution. Then, working together with community leaders and members on how to achieve emissions reductions within our communities.

GREEN JOBS AND ECONOMIC EQUITY

Transitional Green Jobs Program:

Transitioning workers into the Green sector: helping fossil fuel workers to shift to the Green sector via retraining and valuable work experience while ALSO helping unemployed, underemployed, and folks with limited work history gain new skills and knowledge to embark on a successful Green economic sector career with family supporting wages and benefits. The Transitional Green Jobs program subsidizes workers within the program, providing tremendous financial incentives to employers.

Just Transition Fund:

Creation of a segregated fund for a just, equitable transition to a Greener economy. Money in this fund must be used to mitigate facility closures and job layoffs in fossil-fuel related industries as well as the effect of climate change on workers, businesses, and communities.

GREEN, ENERGY EFFICIENT HOUSING AND RENEWABLE ENERGY

Focus on Energy and On-Bill Financing for Homeowners and Renters: *Reintroducing 2021 <u>AB792</u> (Focus on Energy) and <u>AB795</u> (On-Bill Financing)*

Originally, AB792 and AB795 came from the Governor's Task Force on Climate recommendations, but did not even receive a public hearing from the GOP. We will be reintroducing these bills in January 2023 to start helping homeowners and renters to save on energy, many of whom are already disproportionately struggling with the adverse effects of climate change

Renewable Energy Program:

Establishing a prominent renewable energy program in Wisconsin with 2 main goals:

- 1. Establishing a minimum percentage of statewide electric power that must be generated via renewable energy systems
- 2. Moving Wisconsin towards a zero emission electrical demand system by 2040
