Keynote Speaker

Michael Nguyen

Michael Nguyen is a mindfulness instructor and counselor committed to serving veterans, first responders and trauma victims as they overcome PTSD and associated challenges. Brother Michael was ordained as a monk by Zen Master Thich Nhat Hanh on May 26, 2002. He received full ordination in 2007, and was certified as a Dharma teacher in 2010. He has led retreats worldwide, including in Italy, the United States, Thailand, Vietnam, Germany, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Hong Kong.

Before entering the monastery, Michael served in the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps during Desert Storm and Desert Shield from 1991 to 1995. During his time of service, Brother Michael saw combat. In recent years, he has become increasingly engaged in serving the veteran community and others suffering from PTSD through the practice of mindfulness. He has recently left the monastery on an extended sabbatical to develop this ministry. He is based in Nashville, Tennessee.



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
