Rep. Rodriguez Begins Third Term in 103rd Wisconsin State Legislature

MADISON - State Representative Jessie Rodriguez (R-Oak Creek) took the oath of office during an inauguration day ceremony Tuesday beginning her third term representing the 21st Assembly District in the 103rd Wisconsin State Legislature. Rep. Rodriguez joined 63 of her Republican colleagues, the largest GOP majority since 1957.

"Last session, my colleagues and I proved we are dedicated to proposing sound ideas to address issues that are important to our constituents. Our unemployment rate is at a historic low, we continue to create more jobs and each year since 2010 Wisconsin's business climate continues to improve ranking 11th in the country among the best states to do business," said Rep. Rodriguez.

Last session, Assembly Republicans developed the Forward Agenda; a conservative plan to address pressing issues impacting the state. Republicans intend to build on that agenda in the new legislative session. Transportation issues, K-12 education and eliminating barriers to family-supporting jobs, are among the top priorities for Assembly Republicans this session.

"I am eager to get back to work for the 21st Assembly District and the residents of our great state," said Rep.Rodriguez. "I intend on working with my colleagues to continue improving K-12 education, strengthening our economy and building strong communities."

Rep. Rodriguez was first elected to the state Assembly in 2013 during a special election. The 21st Assembly District is located in the southeast corner of Milwaukee County, including the communities of South Milwaukee, Oak Creek and a portion of Franklin.
