## Protecting Our Kids

**MADISON** – Rep. Jessie Rodriguez (R-Oak Creek) joined her Assembly Republican colleagues in supporting a package of bills aimed at protecting children and supporting women and girls in sports.

“The Save Women’s Sports Acts for K-12 students [[2025 Assembly Bill 100](#)] and collegiate athletes [[2025 Assembly Bill 102](#)] defend Wisconsin’s female athletes. These bills will ensure our women and girls are able to fairly participate in competitive sports by preventing biological males from competing against biological females,” began Rodriguez. “Men often have physical advantages to women and are on average taller, stronger, and faster. These bills ensure women and girls have an even playing field in their sports. The Save Women’s Sports Acts will also promote safety of women and girls by prohibiting male students from utilizing the female locker room.”

The [December 2024 Marquette Law School Poll](#) reported that 76% of respondents nationwide support requiring transgender athletes to play on teams that match the sex they were assigned at birth. “Assembly Republicans are standing with the vast majority of Americans by passing these bills,” said Rep. Rodriguez.

2025 Assembly Bill 105 ([AB 105](#)) establishes an age verification system when accessing explicit materials to ensure obscene content cannot be readily accessed by minors online. “Harmful online content has a negative impact on our kids’ mental and emotional development, and can have long-term adverse effects,” explained Rodriguez. “While electronic devices might have parental controls; sometimes kids are able to bypass these restrictions and find inappropriate content. This bill provides another stop-gap to prevent children from being exposed to harmful content online,” concluded Rep. Rodriguez. AB 105 passed with a bipartisan vote of [69-22](#).

Following today’s Floor Session, each of these bills will now go to the State Senate for consideration.
