Proposed Moderator

1. In 2013, the Supreme Court ruled that section 4b of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 was unconstitutional. Section 4b of the law defined which jurisdictions were required to obtain federal approval before changing voting laws. Today, these jurisdictions can now freely change voting laws without needing pre-clearance from federal courts to do so. How do you think has affected voter disenfranchisement and voter suppression?
 - a. The barriers that prevent access to voting are now more subtle than the overt tactics negated by the 1965 Voting Rights Act. These new tactics include a restrictive photo ID requirement, burdensome proof of residency in order to register to vote, and continued restrictions to in-person absentee voting.
 - b. The most recent ruling of the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals in the One Wisconsin Institute case is the perfect example of these subtle tactics that are prevailing in court. The court held that Republican lawmakers were merely acting in their own party-interest and did not consider race when creating more barriers for voters of color.
 - c. As a result, they upheld the restriction of in-person absentee voting hours, lengthier residency requirements that adversely affect transient voters, and no longer allowing clerks to email ballots to voters who are not in the military or permanently overseas, despite the unequal impact that these laws have on voters in poverty and of color.
2. Do you believe that COVID-19 contributed and/or impacted voter disenfranchisement at the polls? Specifically, around access to polling places, mail-in ballots and large wait times to vote?
 - a. COVID-19 has disproportionately affected African American and Hispanic voters throughout City. COVID-19 also had a disproportionate effect on voting among African American and Hispanic voters in the April 7 Spring Election and Presidential Primary. The Wisconsin Supreme Court insisted the State of Wisconsin hold the Spring Election and Presidential Primary despite election officials' pleas and the Governor's order to delay the election. Voters did not have adequate time to request and receive a by-mail ballot, the City of Milwaukee did not have enough poll workers or polling places, and the City was not given enough time to properly ensure that polling places and workers had all of the PPE and safety protocols necessary during a pandemic.
 - b. The disenfranchisement was largely attributed to the consolidation of polling places. Normally the Election Commission would have 180 polling places strategically placed on public transit routes within or as close to a voter's neighborhood as possible. The City reduced Election Day voting to just five voting centers on April 7 due to a poll worker shortage and the legislature and court systems' refusal to delay the election. Fear of contracting COVID-19 was not limited to just voters. Over 60% of Milwaukee's election workers are over the age of 60 and at higher risk for contraction. Understandably, many were unable to work at early in-person absentee voting or on Election Day and the usual election staff of 2,200 was reduced to only 300 workers due to this unparalleled level of fear of the pandemic.
3. Let's talk about the racial justice uprisings we saw over the summer. Is there a strong distinction between political protest and civic engagement? Do they support one another? How do you think this summer's relationship with demonstrations impacted voter turnout this year?
4. All of our speakers are coming from different positions, and you all had unique experiences in this year's unprecedented election. What did you see, from your unique perspective, that

worked and didn't work in this year's election? How do you propose that cities and municipalities move forward?

- a. The City of Milwaukee Election Commission received an unprecedented amount of funding support through a private grant from the Center for Tech and Civic Life. With over 3 million dollars in additional funding, the Commission was able to expand early voting locations, add 15 absentee drop boxes across the City, expand voter education, purchase the additional equipment needed to process the increase in absentee ballots, and, most importantly, ensure that polling places were all open, well-staffed and safe. These measures ensured that voters had more voting options than ever before despite the pandemic. This funding reaffirmed the importance of investing in our election infrastructure and community outreach so that citizens' voices are heard.
 - b. Wisconsin is one of only four states that does not allow any pre-processing of absentee ballots. As a result, our election workers had to work nearly 24 hours in a room with over 400 workers at a time in order to process absentee ballots on November 3rd. To convene this many people in one place for an extended period of time as COVID19 surged in Wisconsin was reckless on the part of the Wisconsin legislature. Moving forward, we will continue to advocate for common sense election laws that are based on facts and the professional recommendations of election administrators.
5. Why is voter education important? When we divest from voter education (civic education in schools, etc), what are the consequences on voter turnout, and how does it create a racial gap?
- a. Voter education remains essential to ensure that we have a participatory democracy. During COVID19, the City of Milwaukee saw a disproportionate amount of distrust and confusion surrounding voting by mail in communities of color. This was evidenced both by the rejection rate of absentee ballots that were not completed correctly, as well as the number of voters in communities of color who chose to vote in-person instead of by mail.
 - b. Milwaukee attempted to expand voter education, especially around voting by mail, by sending post cards to every single household in the City. The post cards encouraged voters to update their voter registration and to request a mail-in ballot. Most importantly, though, the post card also promoted the 6 weeks of voter assistance available at every Milwaukee Public Library. These voter assistance centers were heavily utilized both by voters wanting assistance in requesting a mail-in ballot, as well as by voters who had questions or concerns about the voting process. They were key bridges within the community to combat voter misinformation and instill trust in the democratic process.
6. What are some challenges that you feel we face when trying to broaden political movements to include young voices and people of color? How can we combat this?
7. We often hear the phrase "all politics is local". Can you talk to us about why races like school board, county sheriff, and district attorney matter just as much if not more than the presidential election?
8. As of last week, national attention was turned to cities like Philadelphia and Atlanta, and Detroit to determine the winner of the presidential election—these are all cities with large Black populations who really helped drive the outcome in this election. How do elected leaders deliver on the trust that Black voters put into them this presidential election?

9. There is growing support for statehood in both DC and Puerto Rico. What relevance does statehood have toward advancing federal and local voting rights? Why is there not greater attention to empowering majority Latinx and majority Black voters in these jurisdictions with access to congressional representation?
10. This election year brought record turnout across the country for the presidential but not as much for down-ballot initiatives. How can we channel the energy around the presidential election to ensure all races experience similar enthusiasm?

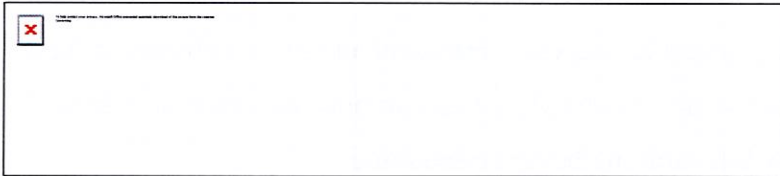

Description: The impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on voting are far reaching. With in person voting affected by safety concerns, voting by mail affected by misinformation, and more election administration issues, there's a clear need to address how we vote in this country. As we know, inequities among racial and ethnic minority groups mean we also see a lack of equity and access at the ballot box and within our elections system for the full spectrum of our Democracy.

At this year's City Summit, we will use pre-election and post-election outcomes as the framing for this important dialogue on measures that restrict voter access and its impact on marginalized, underserved and vulnerable communities. City Leaders on the panel will be given an opportunity to speak freely on what went right in advocating for marginalized and disenfranchised voters, what went wrong, why those gaps exist and what it will take to fix it from a municipal perspective.

Food Insecurity in the U.S. by the Numbers

A recent report from NPR compiled data from numerous sources to **explore the landscape of food insecurity in the U.S.** According to data from the **USDA**, 35 million Americans, or 10.5 percent of all U.S. households, experienced food insecurity during 2019. Researchers at Northwestern University have estimated that this rate may have **more than doubled** in 2020, reaching nearly 23 percent of households this year, due to the economic impact of the coronavirus. Additionally, an estimated 29.5 percent of households with children were food insecure, according to **an analysis** conducted in June 2020. The data clearly indicate disparities in rate of food insecurity, with higher rates for **Black and Hispanic households**. In addition, adults with disabilities experience more than two times the rate as those without disabilities.

COVID-19 Is Making Women's Economic Situation Even Worse

An analysis from the **National Women's Law Center** explores the disproportionate impact of the pandemic and resulting economic crisis on women, particularly women of color. According to the data, more than half of Black, non-Hispanic women (54.5 percent), Asian, non-Hispanic women (56.3 percent), and Latinas (63.7 percent) reported a loss of income since March, compared to 45.1 percent of white, non-Hispanic men and 46 percent of white, non-Hispanic women. Food scarcity is also a significant concern, as the data showed that more than one in five Black, non-Hispanic women and Latinas reported not having enough food in the past week. Additionally, more than two in five Black, non-Hispanic women and Latinas reported facing housing insecurity compared to 15.4 percent of white, non-Hispanic men.

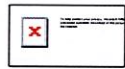

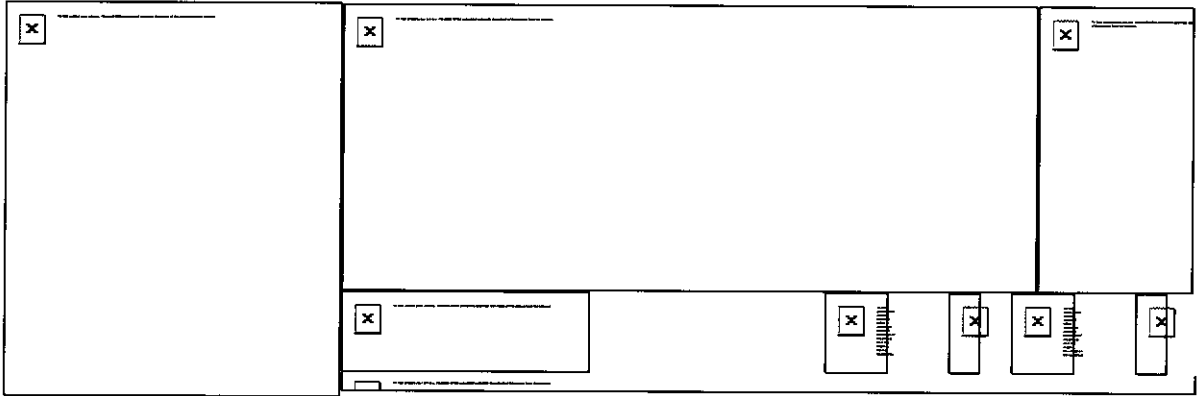
