Rep. Callahan Fully Backs Gableman Investigation

[Madison, WI] – State Representative Calvin Callahan (R-Tomahawk) issued the following statement on Monday regarding the ongoing Wisconsin election investigation:

"I've spoken with a lot of folks around the 35th Assembly District in regards to the administration of the November 2020 election. With the recent conclusion of the <u>nonpartisan audit</u> coming out from the Legislative Audit Bureau (LAB) and the announcement of the investigation by the Racine County Sheriff's Office (RCSO) into absentee ballots at long-term care facilities, many continue to lose faith in our elections process. Election integrity is the cornerstone of our democratic republic, which is why I want my constituents to know that this is a top-priority of mine.

"The reports from the LAB and RCSO have shown us that we need to continue investigating this matter until completion. Justice Gableman will continue his investigation into violations of state election law, regardless of what Governor Evers, Attorney General Kaul, and other legislative Democrats do or say. As the LAB and RCSO have already investigated, the Wisconsin Elections Commission has been extremely mismanaged. I have called previously for the resignation of Meagan Wolfe as the WEC Administrator and renew that call again today.

"So far, Justice Gableman has said that his investigation has centered on the influence of outside money in Wisconsin elections, voting machines, and local clerk authority and WEC issues. To be clear, I back Justice Gableman and his investigation 100%, along with a deeper dive into the absentee ballot issue at long-term care facilities, uncovered by the RCSO. As long as I'm your state representative, I will always work to ensure our state has honest, secure elections for the future."
