Members of the Wisconsin Legislative LGBTQ+ Caucus: Trump's Anti-Trans Actions are Invasive and Infringe on Athletes' Privacy

MADISON, Wis. — This week, Donald Trump signed an executive order designed to prohibit transgender athletes from participating in sporting events that align with their gender, reversing protections for LGBTQ+ Americans put in place by the Biden Administration.

Members of the Wisconsin Legislative LGBTQ+ Caucus released the following statement in response:

"We condemn Donald Trump's executive order to curtail the rights of trans Americans in the strongest terms. The federal administration's actions are discriminatory, deeply wrong, and harmful to the LGBTQ+ community.

"The bottom line is this: every young person deserves the opportunity to participate in sports and activities that support their health and well-being. Playing sports with their friends and classmates helps all kids feel like they belong—and any action to ban participation is invasive and infringes on athletes' privacy."
