Murphy Statement on Review of General Election

MADISON, WI — Today, the Wisconsin State Assembly Committee on Campaigns and Elections held a public hearing to conduct a review of the 2020 General Election. The committee heard from election officials and citizens who participated in the election process.

Member of the committee, State Representative Dave Murphy (R–Greenville) issued the following statement:

"The testimony provided to the legislature today raises significant concerns about the reliability of elections in our state. I am appalled by big city polling places staffed by poorly trained election officials who bullied, intimidated, and obstructed election observers. Wisconsin Election Commission bureaucrats broke state law by not following proper procedures. The impropriety exercised in this election was demonstrated as so widespread, that I feel the election as a whole violated Wisconsin law.

"My oath requires that I uphold the laws of our state and nation. We received clear and credible evidence today that the presidential electors were improperly certified by the Wisconsin Elections Commission and governor. As a member of the Wisconsin Legislature, I believe it's appropriate to exercise our constitutional authority to decertify the slate of presidential electors or delay their convening until a full audit can be completed.

"Based on the evidence and testimony provided today, I will work with my colleagues to ensure our election laws cannot be warped and abused so easily in the future."
