## Rep. Rob Brooks Inaugurated for a second term

**Madison, WI**—Today, the 103<sup>rd</sup> Wisconsin State Legislature was gaveled into session with the inauguration of all new members and those who won reelection in November. Representative Brooks was sworn-in for a second term and will represent Wisconsin's Sixtieth District in the State Assembly.

"I am humbled and honored to have been entrusted, once again, by the voters of Wisconsin's Sixtieth Assembly District, to be their voice in Madison," Brooks stated. This session, I look forward to working with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle on consequential issues such as transportation and education funding. More important, I am committed to enacting legislation that creates jobs, reduces the tax burden, and continues moving Wisconsin forward," Brooks said.

When the 103<sup>rd</sup> state legislature gavels into session, later today, Representative Brooks will officially assume his responsibilities as Assistant Majority Leader—a position he was elected to, unanimously, by his Republican colleagues, early last month. As Assistant Majority Leader, Representative Brooks will serve as Chairman of the Joint Legislative Council Committee and a member of the Legislative Organization and Assembly Rules Committees.

Representative Brooks is one of sixty-four Republicans for the 2017-2018 legislative session. This represents the largest Republican majority since 1957.

"It was an honor to be selected by my peers to serve in a leadership position after just one-term. I am committed to working diligently to ensure that Wisconsin continues to prosper and citizens are afforded with ample opportunities to live a prosperous life," Brooks said
