Rep. Jerry O'Connor Responds to Governor Evers' Budget Address

Madison, WI—Representative Jerry O'Connor (R-Fond du Lac) released the following statement in response to Governor Evers' Budget Address:

"I came to Madison to advocate for the people of Fond du Lac. They overwhelmingly want to keep more of their hard-earned money and have less government intrusion in their lives. Unfortunately, Governor Evers' budget proposal last night was more of the same old unbelievable liberal wish list that would take our state backward.

The Governor's proposal is a combination of smoke and mirrors. His claim to reduce taxes by \$2 billion is misleading. He is reducing your property taxes while increasing taxes by over \$3.7 billion. Wisconsin would end up with some of the highest income tax rates in the country.

Evers wants to hire 1,300 new bureaucrats and increase state spending by **<u>\$20 billion</u>**, which is an increase of more than 14% over the current budget. Would this budget work in your home? Using simple math, you ask, how can you balance your checkbook when you increase spending by \$20 billion and increase taxes by \$3.7 billion? Answer: <u>You can't</u>.
