I am pleased to have cosponsored many important bills which have passed and are now signed into law, and I remain hopeful more will be enacted in the remaining few months. However, we should be doing so much more to address the needs of the people of Wisconsin.

I was honored to attend a Holiday Reception at the Governor's Executive Residence and remain grateful for his leadership in his first year of service.

As always there have been a lot of events in the district. I did an hour long interview on legalization of medical marijuana with Lenny Palmer on his morning show on WLIP, AM1050. I always enjoy talking with Lenny on issues of the day and thank him for the opportunity.

I took part in the Tourism Partner Appreciation Night at the Kenosha Museum. Tourism plays a huge role in our economy, both locally and of course for the entire state. Coincidentally, I was also named to serve on the Tourism Committee to fill an empty seat there. Also at the museum, a celebration was held for outgoing General Manager of the Kenosha Water Utility Ed St. Peter and Assistant General Manager Dave Lewis for their retirements. I wish them well and thank them for their decades of service in providing us with clean safe and affordable drinking water.

Representative Tip McGuire and I met with a local building contractor to talk about the issues important to their industry and the impact of a bill to help

contractors which is advancing in the Ways & Means Committee, which we both serve on.

We are very fortunate Selah Freedom has chosen Kenosha to place a safe house for survivors of human trafficking and sexual exploitation here. I'm also pleased to report the Assembly voted on a resolution I was pleased to cosponsor proclaiming January 2020 Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Month.
