Statement on Governor's Issuance of Executive Order #105

Madison, WI – Yesterday, hours after Republicans in the Assembly concurred <u>Senate Joint Resolution 3</u>, revoking Governor Evers' Executive Order #104, the governor issued another public health emergency, <u>Executive Order #105</u>.

Representative Nancy VanderMeer (R-Tomah) released the following statement:

"As I stated <u>yesterday</u>, I believe <u>Wisconsin law</u> is clear on this issue. Whether the governor likes it or not, we have three branches of government in the state, and we have three branches for a reason. A number of residents of the 70th Assembly District and the entire state, for that matter, are understandably alarmed and aggravated to repeatedly see our laws overtly ignored and subverted by radical partisans in Madison, including the governor and his advisors. It's simply unacceptable. I agree with Senate Majority Leader LeMahieu and what he recently <u>shared</u>. The Legislature has done our part to stop this lawlessness. Only a court can stop a governor bent on ignoring the law. We'll continue to eagerly await a Wisconsin Supreme Court decision in <u>Jere Fabick v.</u>
Tony Evers."
