MADISON, WI – On September 12th, Governor Evers, The University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics Authority and UW Nurses announced a tentative agreement that will avoid the 3-day strike planned for this week. On this agreement, Rep. Stubbs (D-Madison) released the following statement:
