The United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) has been created to provide mutually beneficial trade between the United States, Mexico, and Canada generating a fairer and freer market in North America. This agreement has the capacity to generate economic growth, which will benefit us tremendously here in Wisconsin as well as across the United States.

My colleagues and I recently sent a letter to our Wisconsin Congressional Delegation to urge them to support the USMCA at the federal level. It was sent specifically to our Congressman Ron Kind of the 3rd Congressional District of Wisconsin for him to encourage Speaker Nancy Pelosi to hold a vote as soon as possible on the USMCA.

This agreement will greatly benefit our workers from all industries across Wisconsin. There have been hundreds of companies coming together to form a coalition to urge Congress to approve the USMCA.
