Re: Absentee Ballot

Dear Rep Allen,

As you know I filed a complaint with the Wisconsin Elections Commission on November 19, 2020 because my mentally incompetent 103 year old mother, [REDACTED] voted in the November 3, 2020 election. Thanks to Dan for calling me to discuss this complaint.

I have since learned that my mother's vote was actually cast, on her behalf, by a deputy at the nursing home where she lives. This was done even though she told representatives there, years ago, that she no longer wanted to vote. Sensibly, she realized that she wasn't informed enough to choose candidates.

At this time we are frustrated because there is apparently no expedient way to rescind her request to receive an absentee ballot. I was told by the Wauwatosa City Clerk that we need a court order declaring her mentally incompetent before she will be removed from voter rolls. This is an unreasonable and an undue burden on her and our family.

When it comes to absentee ballots and dead or incapacitated people voting I guess all roads lead back to the Wisconsin Legislature.

Please do whatever you can to amend the absentee ballot laws so that her status is evaluated and refreshed or discontinued upon family request.

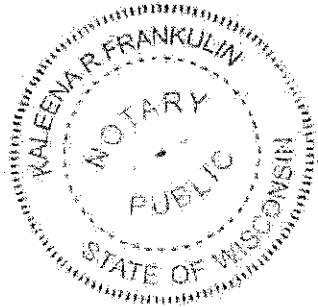

Dear District Attorney John T. Chisholm,

Thank-you for prosecuting vote fraud in the Milwaukee County Justice System.

I am writing on behalf of my 103-year-old mother, [REDACTED] I am her son and designated attorney-in-fact according to her estate plan. She resides at the [REDACTED] She is mentally incapable of voting yet she voted in the last presidential election.

On October 28, 2009 she was judged to be unable to receive and evaluate information or to communicate to such an extent that she lacks the capacity to manage her health care decisions. During 2010 she verbally informed family and staff at [REDACTED] that she no longer wanted to vote. At her birthday party on December 3, 2020 she barely opened her eyes and did not recognize family members.

This will inform you that my mother, [REDACTED] was a victim of vote fraud on November 2, 2020 for two reasons:

First, on January 4, 2021, I was informed by [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] that its employees facilitated her vote. I don't believe these employees were designated voter deputies. The Wauwatosa City Clerk confirmed that her ballot was signed, witnessed, filed and cast.

Second, according to <https://myvote.wi.gov/en-US/TrackMyBallot> she is registered as [REDACTED] This is an incorrect corruption of her actual name. [REDACTED] Her birth certificate lists her name as [REDACTED] Her passport lists [REDACTED] All official correspondence from WI Dept of Health lists her as [REDACTED] The incorrect name on the ballot application suggests that her ballot was forged and filed without proper validation.

At this time, I have filed an election fraud complaint with the Wauwatosa Police Department, [REDACTED] Staff Attorney, Wisconsin Elections Commission and WI Reps. Scott Allen [REDACTED]

I look forward to your investigation and findings.

I am in receipt of a Section 5.06 complaint filed with the Wisconsin Elections Commission (“WEC” or “Commission”), received on February 15, 2021 against the Clerk in the City of Wauwatosa, Melanie Kollmansberger. The administrative rules governing the WEC’s processing of complaints require that I review the complaint and determine within 10 business days whether the complaint is timely, is sufficient as to form and states probable cause. Wis. Admin. Code § EL 20.04(1). I am writing to inform you that I have determined that the complaint is not in proper form as you are not an elector in the City of Wauwatosa, and you are therefore not a proper party to filing a complaint with our office under Wis. Stat. § 5.06. Therefore, I am returning the complaint to you without prejudice pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.06 and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 20.04(1) and (2).

Sufficiency as to Form

Wis. Stat. § 5.06(1) states:

Whenever any elector of a jurisdiction or district served by an election official believes that a decision or action of the official or the failure of the official to act with respect to any matter concerning nominations, qualifications of candidates, voting qualifications, including residence, ward division and numbering, recall, ballot preparation, election administration or conduct of elections is contrary to law, or the official has abused the discretion vested in him or her by law with respect to any such matter, the elector may file a written sworn complaint with the commission requesting that the official be required to conform his or her conduct to the law, be restrained from taking any action inconsistent with the law or be required to correct any action or decision inconsistent with the law or any abuse of the discretion vested in him or her by law. The complaint shall set forth such facts as are within the knowledge of the complainant to show probable cause to believe that a violation of law or abuse of discretion has occurred or will occur. The complaint may be accompanied by relevant supporting documents. The commission may conduct a hearing on the matter in the manner prescribed for treatment of contested cases under ch. 227 if it believes such action to be appropriate. (Emphasis added)


You state in your sworn complaint that your address is in Waukesha, therefore you are not an elector that is served by the clerk in the City of Wauwatosa. Under Wis. Stat. § 5.06, only an “elector” of a jurisdiction or district may file a complaint.

Conclusion

I am returning the complaint, without prejudice pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § EL 20.04(3), as it is not sufficient to form. As required by that provision, I have specified the defects in the complaint (form – not a proper complainant). As to the information which would be appropriate to cure the defect, only electors that reside in a municipality served by the individuals named may file a complaint under Wis. Stat. § 5.06. Since the complaint is improper as to form, the complaint has not been accepted as proper by the Commission under its administrative rules.

The Commission now considers this complaint matter closed.
