- Since 1969, Sixteenth Street has been a community leader in primary health services for our city's most vulnerable residents
- Sixteenth Street maintains Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) status
- Our reputation for compassion, innovation, and quality is recognized both locally and nationally
- An independent non-profit agency, Sixteenth Street has multiple locations, including four full-service medical clinics, one BH clinic, thirteen in-school clinics, and a Women, Infants & Children (WIC) nutrition program
- Now cares for more than 41,000 people





LANGUAGES







