BUILDING COMMISSION AND BUILDING PROGRAM

Omnibus Motion
[LFB Paper #190]

Motion:

Move the following provisions:

Building Commission

1. *General Obligation Refunding Authority.* Increase the amount of state public debt that may be contracted to refund unpaid indebtedness for tax-supported or self-amortizing facilities by \$2.0 billion, from \$7.51 billion to \$9.51 billion.
2. *Use of Bond Proceeds and Premiums for Costs of Administering Debt.* Authorize the state to use bond proceeds for the costs of administering public debt and to use premium proceeds from the sale of bonds for costs incurred in contracting and administering public debt. Specify that the bonding authorization would not be reduced by the amount of premiums used for these expenses.
3. *Encourage Community Foundation Construction Grant.* Authorize the Building Commission to provide \$3.0 million of GPR-supported bonding to assist the Incourage Community Foundation, Inc., in the remodeling of the former Daily Tribune building in the City of Wisconsin Rapids into an economic and community hub. Require that the state funding commitment be in the form of a grant to the Incourage Community Foundation, Inc. [funded from the Commission's existing \$25.0 million authorization for construction projects with a public purpose]. Further, specify that before approving any state funding commitment for the remodeling of the former Daily Tribune Building, the Building Commission would be required to make a determination that the that the Incourage Community Foundation, Inc., has secured additional funding for the project of at least \$3.0 million from non-state revenue sources. Require that, if the Building Commission makes a grant to the Incourage Community Foundation, Inc., for the remodeling of the former Daily Tribune Building into an economic and community hub, the state would retain an ownership interest in the remodeled space equal to the amount of the state's grant if, for any reason, the remodeled space is not used for an economic and community hub. Specify that the Legislature finds and determines that supporting entrepreneurs and innovators, providing facilities for job training, and promoting dynamic community revitalization and development are of vital importance in creating jobs and contributing to economic development and tourism in this state and are statewide responsibilities of statewide dimension. Further, specify that it is in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to assist the

Incourage Community Foundation, Inc., in the remodeling of the former Daily Tribune building in the City of Wisconsin Rapids into an economic and community hub.

Building Program

Project Enumerations

Approve the following projects for the 2021-23 state building program:

4. *Administration -- Milwaukee -- New State Office Building.* Provide \$163,629,000 of program revenue supported borrowing and enumerate this project at a total cost of \$163,629,000.

5. *Administration -- Madison -- GEF 1 State Office Building Replacement.* Allocate \$4,000,000 of building trust funds to develop preliminary plans and specifications for the replacement of the GEF 1 state office building and the redevelopment of block 108 in Madison.

6. *Building Commission -- Beyond Vision Center.* Provide \$5,000,000 of general fund supported borrowing to assist Wiscraft, Inc. in purchasing and renovating a facility in Milwaukee County for the employment of and provision of other related services to blind and visually impaired individuals and enumerate this project at a total cost of \$19,000,000. Require that the state funding commitment be in the form of a grant to Wiscraft, Inc. Specify that, before approving any state funding commitment for the construction of the center, the Building Commission make a determination that Wiscraft, Inc. has secured additional funding for the project of at least \$14,000,000 from non-state revenue sources. Require that if the Building Commission makes a grant to Wiscraft, Inc., for the construction of the Beyond Vision center, the state would retain an ownership interest in the remodeled space equal to the amount of the state's grant if, for any reason, the space is not used for the employment of and provision of other related services to blind and visually impaired individuals. Specify that the Legislature finds and determines that the employment of individuals who are blind or visually impaired, including statewide remote employment, and the provision of other related services to those individuals, improves those individuals' lives, increases the workforce and reduces unemployment in this state, and is a statewide responsibility of statewide dimension. Further specify that it is in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to assist Wiscraft, Inc., with constructing the Beyond Vision center for the employment of and provision of other related services to blind and visually impaired individuals. Specify that the Building Commission may not make a grant to Wiscraft, Inc., for the construction of the center unless DOA has reviewed and approved plans for the project, although DOA may not supervise any services or work or let any contracts for the project. Further specify that the contracts for the project would not require approval of the DOA Secretary or the Governor. Create a GPR sum sufficient appropriation to fund the debt service payments and any payments on an agreement or ancillary arrangement associated with the bonding authorized for the project. Provide that these payments could be made through the bond security and redemption fund appropriation.

7. *Building Commission -- Kenosha STEM Innovation Center.* Provide \$9,750,000 of general fund supported borrowing to the City of Kenosha to construct a STEM innovation center at the site previously occupied by the Chrysler facility in the city and enumerate this project at a total

cost of \$19,500,000. Require that the state funding commitment be in the form of a grant to the City of Kenosha. Specify that, before approving any state funding commitment for the construction of the center, the Building Commission make a determination that the City of Kenosha has secured additional funding for the project of at least \$9,750,000 from non-state revenue sources. Require that if the Building Commission makes a grant to the City of Kenosha for the construction of the STEM innovation center, the state would retain an ownership interest in the space equal to the amount of the state's grant if, for any reason, the space is not used as a science, technology, engineering, and mathematics innovation center. Specify that the Legislature finds and determines that meeting the state's workforce needs, providing opportunities for residents of this state to learn new job skills, and supporting innovation and entrepreneurship in this state are of vital importance in expanding industries in this state, creating jobs, and improving the municipal, regional, and state economies and are statewide responsibilities of statewide dimension. Further specify that it is in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to assist the city of Kenosha in the construction of a STEM innovation center located in the city of Kenosha. Specify that the Building Commission may not make a grant to the City of Kenosha for the construction of the center unless DOA has reviewed and approved plans for the project, although DOA may not supervise any services or work or let any contracts for the project. Further specify that the contracts for the project would not require approval of the DOA Secretary or the Governor. Create a GPR sum sufficient appropriation to fund the debt service payments and any payments on an agreement or ancillary arrangement associated with the bonding authorized for the project. Provide that these payments could be made through the bond security and redemption fund appropriation.

8. *Building Commission -- Wisconsin Museum of Nature and Culture.* Provide \$40,000,000 of general fund supported borrowing to the Milwaukee Development Corporation to construct a Wisconsin Museum of Nature and Culture to be located in the City of Milwaukee and enumerate this project at a total cost of \$170,000,000. Require that the state funding commitment be in the form of a grant to the Milwaukee Development Corporation. Specify that, before approving any state funding commitment for the construction of the museum, the Building Commission make a determination that the Milwaukee Development Corporation has secured additional funding for the project of at least \$130,000,000 from non-state revenue sources. Require that if the Building Commission makes a grant to the Milwaukee Development Corporation for the construction of the museum, the state would retain an ownership interest in the space equal to the amount of the state's grant if, for any reason, the space is not used as a museum of nature and culture. Specify that the Legislature finds and determines that providing education, programming, and immersive exhibits concerning Wisconsin's natural history and the intersection of nature and culture in Wisconsin and the world vastly enriches the lives of the citizens of this state and is a statewide responsibility of statewide dimension. Further specify that it is in the public interest, and it is the public policy of this state, to assist the Milwaukee Development Corporation in the construction of a new building to serve as a natural history museum known as the Wisconsin Museum of Nature and Culture in the City of Milwaukee. Specify that the Building Commission may not make a grant to the Milwaukee Development Corporation for the construction of the museum unless DOA has reviewed and approved plans for the project, although DOA may not supervise any services or work or let any contracts for the project. Further specify that the contracts for the project would not require approval of the DOA Secretary or the Governor. Create a GPR sum sufficient appropriation to fund the debt service payments and any payments on an agreement or ancillary arrangement associated with the

bonding authorized for the project. Provide that these payments could be made through the bond security and redemption fund appropriation.

9. *Corrections -- Central Generating Plant -- Water System Infrastructure.* Provide \$7,114,900 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$7,114,900.

10. *Corrections -- Oshkosh Correctional Institution -- Secure Residential Treatment and Diversion Units.* Provide \$2,580,000 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$2,580,000.

11. *Corrections -- Milwaukee County -- Juvenile Corrections Facility.* Provide \$45,791,000 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$45,791,000.

12. *Corrections -- Wisconsin Secure Program Facility -- New Health Services Unit.* Provide \$7,792,000 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$7,792,000.

13. *Corrections -- Dodge Correctional Institution -- New Health Services Unit.* Provide \$18,596,000 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$18,596,000.

14. *Corrections -- Green Bay Correctional Institution -- New Health Services Unit.* Provide \$12,500,000 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$12,500,000.

15. *Corrections -- Jackson Correctional Institution -- Health Services Unit Remodel and Expansion.* Provide \$4,400,000 of general fund supported borrowing and enumerate this project for a total cost of \$4,400,000.

total cost of \$1,462,200.

69. *All Agency -- Facility Maintenance and Repair.* Provide \$130,871,700 of general fund supported borrowing, \$41,261,100 of program revenue supported borrowing, \$9,315,200 of conservation segregated fund supported borrowing, allocate \$8,444,000 of segregated revenue bonds, \$4,432,800 of existing Stewardship borrowing, \$5,908,000 of program revenue cash, \$400,000 of building trust funds, \$5,619,000 of gifts, grants, and other receipts, and \$5,380,500 of federal funds. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$211,632,300.

70. *All Agency -- Utility Repair and Renovation.* Provide \$64,594,300 of general fund supported borrowing, \$29,469,500 of program revenue supported borrowing, \$1,121,000 of conservation segregated fund supported borrowing, \$4,556,000 of segregated revenue bonds, \$1,902,000 of existing Stewardship borrowing, \$4,632,300 of program revenue cash, and \$7,651,600 of federal funds. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$113,926,700.

71. *All Agency -- Health, Safety, and Environmental Protection.* Provide \$37,042,200 of general fund supported borrowing, \$1,589,900 of program revenue supported borrowing, \$2,306,400 of conservation segregated fund supported borrowing, \$161,400 of existing Stewardship borrowing, \$177,800 of program revenue cash, and \$4,458,900 of federal funds. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$45,736,600.

72. *All Agency -- Preventative Maintenance Program.* Provide \$50,000 of general fund supported borrowing and \$325,000 of program revenue cash. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$375,000.

73. *All Agency -- Programmatic Remodeling and Renovation.* Provide \$5,387,500 of general fund supported borrowing, \$1,765,500 of program revenue supported borrowing, \$314,400 of conservation segregated fund supported borrowing, \$259,400 of existing Stewardship borrowing, \$19,579,000 of program revenue cash, \$1,773,000 of gifts, grants, and other receipts, and \$2,446,600 of federal funds. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$31,525,400.

74. *All Agency -- Capital Equipment Acquisition.* Provide \$7,142,000 of general fund supported borrowing, \$508,100 of existing Stewardship borrowing, \$80,200 of program revenue cash, \$467,000 of gifts, grants, and other receipts, and \$2,072,800 of federal funds. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$10,270,100.

75. *All Agency -- Land and Property Acquisition.* Provide \$11,700,000 of program revenue cash and enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$11,700,000.

76. *All Agency -- Energy Conservation.* Provide \$100,000,000 of program revenue supported borrowing and \$358,400 of program revenue cash. Enumerate this all agency program category at a total cost of \$100,358,400.

77. *Statement of Building Program Continuation.* Continue the building and financing authority enumerated under previous building programs into the 2019-21 biennium.

78. *Project Loans.* Authorize the Building Commission, during the 2021-23 biennium, to make loans from general fund supported borrowing or the building trust fund to state agencies for any 2021-23 building program projects not funded by general purpose revenue.

Modifications to Prior Building Programs

79. Modify the 2015-17 building program as follows:

a. Under projects financed by general fund supported borrowing, increase the amount for the "Central Wisconsin Center-life safety renovations Buildings 1 and 6 - Madison" project under the Department of Health Services from \$15,808,000 to \$22,448,400 including \$4,840,400 of general fund supported borrowing, \$15,808,000 of existing general fund supported borrowing, and \$1,800,000 of PR-cash. Provide \$4,840,400 of general fund supported borrowing.

80. Modify the 2017-19 building program as follows:

a. Under projects financed by general fund supported borrowing, change the name of the project identified as "Wisconsin Veterans Home at King - food service system upgrades" to "Wisconsin Veterans Home at King - central services kitchen upgrade" under the Department of Veterans Affairs and increase the amount from \$2,450,300 to \$4,086,200. Provide \$1,635,900 of general fund supported borrowing.

b. Under projects financed by program revenue supported borrowing, change the name of the project identified as "Wisconsin Veterans Home at King - food service system upgrades" to "Wisconsin Veterans Home at King - central services kitchen upgrade" under the Department of Veterans Affairs and increase the amount from \$4,550,700 to \$7,588,800. Provide \$3,038,100 of program revenue supported borrowing.

c.
