## Bi-Partisan Job Access Loan Reform Bill Passes in State Legislature Common sense solution to improve important public program

MADISON – Rep. Stuck issued the following statement on the passage of SB 221, which makes changes to the eligibility requirements for the Job Access Loan program. SB 221 passed on a unanimous vote in the State Senate on October 31<sup>st</sup> and passed the State Assembly on November 2<sup>nd</sup>.
