Lowering the Cost of HealthCare and Expanding Access

- WI Healthcare Stability Plan
 - Reinsurance plan which would cover high cost claims to help stabilize the private health insurance market and reduce premiums in the individual market
 - Molina Healthcare has decided to rejoin the marketplace because of our reforms
- Association Health Plans*
 - Allows small businesses to pool together to offer more affordable health insurance
- Direct Primary Care*

Health Care Investments:

- Increased pay for personal care services workers and Family Care workers
- Fully funded SeniorCare and Medicaid
- Funded grants to expand our healthcare workforce
- Expanded the UW Carbone Cancer Center
- Eliminated Waiting List for Children's Long-Term Support Services

Fighting Drug Abuse and Addiction

- Continued HOPE Agenda. Passed 13 HOPE bills last session, bringing our total to 30 bills since 2013
- Funding for Treatment and Diversion programs
- Increased support for PDMP; opioid prescriptions dispensed over the last year are down 10%
- Easier prosecution of drug dealers and manufacturers of fentanyl analogs (which can be 50 times more potent than heroin)

Support for Life-Saving Treatment Options

- Coverage of pre-existing conditions*
- Right to Try
- Breast Density Notification
- Support for possession of CBD oil for certain medical conditions

Mental Health

- 2 new aid programs for student mental health in schools
- Expansion of the Child Psychiatry Consultation Program

Alzheimer's and Dementia

- Grants for Alzheimer's and dementia awareness
- Increased number of Dementia Care Specialists
- Funding for research

MYTH: We need to take the Medicaid expansion, which will create jobs and provide health insurance to thousands

- WI has struck the right balance in Medicaid with a partial expansion of Medicaid; we cover those in poverty (under 100% FPL) and the federal government covers those above poverty
- We were the only non-expansion state to **not** have a gap in healthcare coverage and we removed the enrollment cap so that more childless adults under 100% FPL have been able to receive care
- Expansion states are now grappling with the increased state cost of expansion. Some states are requesting to roll back coverage to 100% FPL or others "are tapping into tax revenues, making hospitals help, or adding work requirements and premiums to account for their increasing share of the expansion bill."
- There is no guarantee that the federal government will continue to fund this expansion in the future
- We passed the WI Healthcare Stability Plan to help stabilize and lower premiums in the individual market

<u>MYTH</u>: Republicans are trying to get rid of requirements to cover those with pre-existing conditions

- Assembly Republicans passed <u>AB 365</u> which prohibits health insurance policies and plans from considering preexisting conditions for those with continuous coverage when setting premiums, deductibles, and copayments under a plan
- Assembly Democrats voted against this measure

MYTH: Republicans are taking away healthcare options and not investing in affordable healthcare

- We fully funded Medicaid and SeniorCare, in addition to asking for a 10 year SeniorCare waiver
- WI Healthcare Stability Plan will help lower premiums in the individual marketplace
- Assembly GOP voted for Direct Primary Care and Association Health Plans (which allows small businesses to pool together) to help increase affordable access to health care
 - WMC to create statewide association health plan for employers
