## AB 103 - Temporary Licensing of Dentistry

## Summary of Bill (as amended):

Assembly Bill 103 authorizes the Dental Examining Board (Board) to issue a temporary license to practice dentistry or oral hygiene for a period of ten days (maximum) to a person from out-of-state who wishes to provide dentistry or oral hygiene services without compensation.

According to the bill, before issuing a temporary license, the Board: Must make a determination whether or not the practitioner's will improve the welfare of the residents; Must determine if the practitioner satisfies the current criteria for obtaining a license, based on his/her licensure in his/her home state; May choose to renew the temporary license, but may not charge a fee for renewal or issuance.

#### Fiscal Effect:

The fiscal estimate prepared by the Department of Regulations & Licensing states that AB 103 will have a state fiscal impact; however the Department will be able to absorb the \$5,518 one-time cost within their budget.

### Supporters Message:

- Assembly Bill 103 will increase access to dental care for Wisconsin residents who otherwise would not be able to receive necessary care.
- The Board will issue licenses on a temporary basis to qualified practitioners who wish to volunteer their services.

#### Opponents Message:

None apparent, no one testified or registered against AB 103.
