SB 12 Representative Sherman

Summary of Bill (as amended):

Senate Bill 12, as amended, prohibits a person from operating a motorboat, other than a personal watercraft, at a speed in excess of slow-no-wake within 100 feet of the shoreline of any lake.

Assembly Amendment 1 deleted the local "opt out" provision. Instead, the amendment creates a new provision that allows a city, village, town, public inland lake protection and rehabilitation district or town sanitary district to adopt a local ordinance that provides an exemption from the 100 feet of shoreline slow-no-wake requirement, substitute a smaller number for the 100 feet or opt out of a slow-no-wake restriction completely.

Assembly Amendment 1 to Senate Bill 12 was adopted by the committee on a vote of 14 yeas - 0 nays. [Representative Jim Ott absent]

A Legislative Council amendment memo was prepared on AB 3.

Fiscal Effect:

There is no State Fiscal Effect.

Local units of government will incur costs if they enact an ordinance to exempt themselves from the legislation.

Supporters Message:

- The closer to the shore, the better the vegetation, the better the vegetation the better the fishing, and restricting boat speed near the shore will protect valuable fish habitat.
- The bill will help reduce conflicts between boaters, fishermen and swimmers.
- Near shore boating increases the risk of accidents; lowering speeds helps to reduce accidents.

Opponents Message:

Zoning should be a local matter.
