



Kenosha County Population, 1850 - 2014




Racial Composition, 2014




Percent of Population Reporting Hispanic/Latino Ethnicity, 1990-2014



Per Capita Income, 2014




Percent of Population Below Federal Poverty Level, 2014





Kenosha County Population Below Federal Poverty Level by Race/Ethnicity, 2014




Percent of Population who are Food Insecure



Percent of Population Receiving FoodShare, 2010-2014








Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Kenosha County (Adult), 2014




Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Kenosha County (Adult), 2005-2010, 2013 and 2014




Fruit & Vegetable Intake - Adults




Fruit & Vegetable Intake - Bottom 40% Household Income



Fruit & Vegetable Intake - Older Adults (65+ Years)




