Dear Governor Walker,

On behalf of our constituents and law enforcement officials around the state of Wisconsin, we respectfully request that you exercise your power of partial veto regarding the provision in the recently passed 2013-15 State Budget that allows for the practice of commercial bail bonds in Wisconsin. We applauded your actions last biennium when you removed this harmful provision from the 2011-13 state budget and requested a more measured approach. Unfortunately, the budget being presented to you includes a blatant bail bonds industry giveaway that fails to meet your stated requirement. Even worse, it was added to the budget by the Joint Finance Committee just before dawn with no public hearing or discussion.

Wisconsin wisely prohibited for-profit bail bonds in 1979 because the practice undermines the authority of judges and threatens the integrity of judicial elections. The bail bonds provision inserted in the budget has received strong opposition from our elected judges, including the entire First Judicial District of Wisconsin, as well as prosecutors, the Wisconsin Association of Criminal Defense Attorneys, the Badger State Sheriff's Association, the Wisconsin Chiefs of Police Association, the Wisconsin Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriffs Association and all levels of the criminal justice system throughout.

Introducing profit into the pre-trial justice system distorts decisions previously made in the interest of public safety alone. Furthermore, this provision disproportionately impacts low income individuals, and drives up the taxpayer costs of our corrections system. Incentivizing profit has repeatedly led to a culture of rampant corruption in other states, where bail bonds companies use their considerable wealth and political influence to contribute to candidates that allow these companies to operate.

The decision about whether the accused goes free in our state should be in the hands of our judges, who make considerations based upon whether a person is a threat to public safety or is a risk of flight. In states that operate with the commercial bail bond system, decisions about the accused are in the hands of a private business whose goal is to make a profit. Since bail bond companies make additional money granting bonds to higher-bail defendants than lower bail, lower risk defendants, our criminal justice system would return to a situation where decisions of release are governed by forprofit businesses who decide who to offer bonds to. A 2010 feature on National Public Radio highlighted that counties and states spent \$9 billion annually detaining individuals who could not afford bail or bail deposits. Increased costs are likely to be the result in Wisconsin as well without your partial veto.

This corruptive practice was prohibited in 1979 in Wisconsin, and deserves at the very least a public hearing. This provision should not have been slipped into the state budget by the Joint Finance committee at the last minute and at 5:00 a.m. It should be presented as a stand-alone bill to allow public input and deliberate consideration of the consequences of enabling a practice that other states are currently moving in the opposite direction on.

We join the long list of public safety officials and judges who ask you to veto the bail bond provision and remove it from the 2013-2015 State Budget. Thank you for your consideration.
