1. Commonalities

- Generalizations about the Midwestern Region.
- Economic Performance and Growth: sub par.
- Education scores better than workforce --some notable improvements in education e.g. IN,OH; some exceptional education e.g. IA,KS,MN,WI
- Good education may not mean good economic performance; good workforce may not result in superior economic performance. e.g. KS,WI. Its more complex than 'workforce = economic development'
- Business climate varies considerably. But much of the Midwest retains strengths in general business climate: cost of doing business, legal climate and economic freedom. But similar to workforce, superior business climate alone does not ensure superior growth.





2. Vulnerabilites

- In short, the growth equation is far from 'all we need is better workforce' or 'all we need is better financing'. We don't yet know the right/ideal combination of economic foundations and agents for the Midwest—further research is needed +it varies by state.
- We do know two missing ingredients in most Midwestern states are technology competitiveness, entrepreneurial dynamism and international business activity.
- Its all about innovation, productivity improvement and international trade/market expansion in the next growth phase of the business cycle.



Amex semi-annual Small Biz Survey Midwestern States.











3. East and West Midwestern States
