- Description
- Working from secondary sources vs. direct use of primary sources

- Sources available for typical research topics: legislative service agency staff, media and other private publications – law reviews, journal articles, white papers, etc.

Opinions of the Attorney General:

- The Attorney General is a constitutional officer whose duties include issuing opinions on questions presented to the office
- A state employee or agency relying on an opinion of the Attorney General should be able to make a good faith claim of adhering to the law, but it should be noted that the Wisconsin Supreme Court has stated that an opinion of the Attorney General is entitled only to such persuasive effect as the court deems the opinion warrants
