The La Follette School of Public Affairs has a long history of collaborating with state policymakers, sharing its research to inform government decision-making and training the next generation of policymakers. We work closely with the legislature in the following ways:

- Bringing world-class policy experts to Madison in our <u>public events series</u>:
 - Each year we host a policymaker in residence, and each semester we host a journalist in residence. These renowned experts bring their national perspectives to our community. In 2022, we hosted Nate Silver of FiveThirtyEight as journalist in residence, and in 2023, we welcome former Speaker Paul Ryan as our policymaker in residence.
 - Wisconsin Family Impact Seminars La Follette works with the legislature to identify policy issues and then coordinates experts to present a series of nonpartisan seminars specifically directed to legislators.
 - Office Hours at the Capitol we bring UW Madison faculty and staff to the capitol for drop-in events so you can learn more about active research on timely issues
 - <u>La Follette Forum</u> this annual conference for the public features policymakers, practitioners and other experts discussing practical policymaking. 2023 topic: <u>All Policy is Implementation</u>.
- Helping to connect you to resources at the UW:
 - Our outreach team can help connect you to UW-Madison researchers (both within and outside of La Follette) who can serve as sounding boards, provide expert testimony, or provide insights from their research.
- Professional development for students and leaders:
 - Over half of our graduate students go on to take jobs in state government. A close working relationship between La Follette and the legislature helps provide those students with the experiences that they need to be successful in policymaking. Hire our students or host an intern.
 - La Follette has <u>trained legislative staff</u> on skills such as cost-benefit analysis, policy analysis, and legislative processes. We also run the <u>Leadership Seminar</u> for Wisconsin Women in Government.
 - Each year, our students work with external partners to provide policy recommendations. Learn more about <u>partnering with our students</u>.
