

Wisconsin Self-Response





Delivering the Data

The Secretary of Commerce will deliver the final apportionment population counts to the President of the United States and the public as close to December 31 as possible. The President will then deliver them to Congress.

The final counts reveal each state's population, which determines its number of seats in the U.S. House of Representatives. In 2021, we will deliver the local counts that each state needs for legislative redistricting.

The count is now complete, and the Census Bureau is currently processing the data, making sure that everyone is counted once, only once, and in the right place. Here's a look at some of the key upcoming dates, as they are currently scheduled:

2020-2021


- As close to December 31, 2020, as possible: The Census Bureau will deliver population counts used for apportionment to the president as required by law.
- As close to April 1, 2021, as possible: By this date, the Census Bureau will send redistricting counts to the states. This information is used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.







Two Categories of Census Geography


✓ Legal and Administrative Entities

Result from legal actions, treaties, ordinances, and so on. Boundaries generally accepted as provided by appropriate authorities.

✓ Statistical Entities

Evolve from practice, usage, or need. Boundaries generally delineated using Census Bureau criteria and guidelines

• Census Blocks are bounded on all sides by:

Visible Features

Streets

Roads

Streams

Railroad tracks


Invisible Features

Local government boundaries (county, city, village, town)

Property Lines

Imaginary extensions of streets or roads

Wards must follow block boundaries
