Verso paper mill idling

Overview:

On June 9, Verso announced idling of their Duluth, MN and Wisconsin Rapids, WI pulp and paper mills by the end of July 2020, leading to a loss of approximately 1,000 jobs at the two facilities. The Wisconsin Rapids Mill has the capacity to make 540,000 tons of graphic paper used in commercial printing, media and marketing applications. This mill is a major user of hardwood and softwood pulpwood. The mill is being idled indefinitely with potential plans to reopen in better market conditions or sell the mill. This announcement follows a recent change in species mix from hardwood to softwood in April due to COVID-related decline in market demand and internal sourcing needs across sister mills. Furthermore, graphic paper demand has steadily declined since the mid 2000's. Recently, demand has fallen 38% since April 2019, and producers are expected to operate below 70% capacity through the second quarter of 2020 (RISI markets).

In 2019, the Wisconsin Rapids mill employed 915 workers. The company notified Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development of 900 potential layoffs at the Wisconsin Rapids location. This mill represents one of the largest employers in the community of Wisconsin Rapids and in Wood County. Conservatively, it is estimated that the mill represents 10-15% of the total roundwood consumption in the state, and 25% of over two million cords processed by pulp mills in Wisconsin. This idling will negatively impact the regional economy and pulpwood suppliers (i.e. loggers), and both public and private forest owners will face challenges with marketing pulpwood.
