Cases Climb and Nursing Homes Struggle

Over the past week the number of new daily cases of COVID-19 reached over 1,000 for the first time, and the average rate of positive tests increased to 7.4 percent on Sunday. Read more

Early Voting Has Begun for the August 11th Election

Make sure you have an ID for voting purposes

Bringit.wi.gov is the state's website for helping people make sure that they have an ID that will work when they go to cast their ballot. For most Wisconsinites, their driver's license will satisfy this requirement. Bring your ID with you for every step of the following process!

Get registered

You can check your registration through MyVote.wi.gov. Online and postal registration has ended for the upcoming election, so if you are not already registered, you will need to do so in person at your municipal clerk, if necessary you will still be able to do this at the polls on Election Day, but it is best to get it done in advance.

Contact info for all municipal clerks across the state can be found in the Directory of Wisconsin Clerks from the Wisconsin Elections Commission website, or through myvote.wi.gov.

The PSC Voted to Extend the Utility Disconnection Moratorium

Last Thursday the Wisconsin Public Service Commission voted to extend the moratorium on utility disconnections until September 1st.

The moratorium will need to continue until the backlog of unemployment cases is cleared. There are still over 138,000 people waiting to get resolution on their claim, and We Energies alone estimated that 32,000 households could have had their service disconnected for non-payment.

Families who lost their work through no fault of their own would have lost the ability to manage their unemployment claim, do job searches, cooking, education, and so much more from home. The state cannot engage in kicking people when they are down, especially when the source of their struggle is an unemployment system that has been neglected and undermined for decades. Read more

Evers Seeks \$250 Million Cut to State Spending

In order to respond to the loss in revenue related to reduced economic activity since the Coronavirus pandemic has come to Wisconsin, Governor Evers is seeking a \$250 million cut across state agencies. In addition to the \$70 million cut that he asked for in May, the total now comes to \$320 million in budget reductions.

This call was met with push-back from former governor Tommy Thompson, who is now serving as the interim president of the University of Wisconsin System. Thompson explained that the UW System already provided more than half of the \$70 million cut in May.

On July 9th, the Legislative Fiscal Bureau notified the legislature that state revenues were \$749 million behind the previous fiscal year.
