State Senate Passes Special Session Bill

Legislature's plan will provide \$2 billion in tax relief and address child care affordability and availability

Madison- Senate Majority Leader Devin LeMahieu issued the following statement after today's Special Session:

"Governor Evers' workforce proposal would have grown the size of state government, increased state spending by more than \$1 billion, and created onerous regulations on Wisconsin's employers.

"The legislature's plan will put more money in the pocketbooks of Wisconsin families to address the effects of inflation and increasing child care costs.

"An average Wisconsin family with two children in child care will receive a total tax benefit of nearly \$6,000," LeMahieu continued.

"The bill would additionally join Wisconsin into two national licensure compacts, create universal reciprocal occupational licenses, and identify fraud in Wisconsin's unemployment insurance program.

"Strengthening Wisconsin's workforce requires a multi-faceted approach. The plan that passed today will set Wisconsin on the right track to attract and retain the talented workforce employers across the state need," LeMahieu concluded.

Special Session Senate Bill 1 passed the State Senate as amended on a 21-11 vote.
