THE 2021-23 BUDGET HEADS TO THE GOVERNOR'S DESK

On Wednesday, the Wisconsin State Senate voted on the 2021-23 biennial budget, which passed the body with bipartisan support. I proudly cast my vote in favor of the legislation, which will support our state as we move forward from the turbulence of the last year.

This is truly a budget for all Wisconsinites, with something for everyone. A \$3.4 billion tax cut for working families, an increase in Medicaid Assistance payments for healthcare and long-term care workers that provide for our most vulnerable populations, a guarantee of two-thirds state funding for K-12 education for our students, and tax relief for our small businesses that have weathered a difficult year.

The budget contains a middle class tax cut that saves the typical Wisconsin family \$1,200 over the biennium; brings the state's rainy day fund to an unparalleled \$2 billion; makes smart, targeted investments in health care, education, and local roads; and leaves a balance of \$450 million in the state general fund so we can adapt to the needs of Wisconsinites over the next two years.

Republicans in Wisconsin continue to produce fiscally responsible budgets that focus on you, the hardworking taxpayers. You wake up and go to work every day with the understanding that the state government is going to fund the necessary services that your family relies on. This budget does exactly that while putting the extra money that we overcollected back into your pocket.

COMMON-SENSE ELECTION REFORM BILL VETOED

On Wednesday, Governor Evers vetoed a bill that would have prohibited municipalities from using private money to administer elections.

The Chicago-based Center for Tech & Civic Life (CTCL) gave \$10.3 million in grants to Wisconsin municipalities – including Milwaukee, Madison, Kenosha, Racine, and Green Bay. With those grants came a lot of questions about how the elections were administered and whether or not they were secure.

The most notable example of this happened in Green Bay, where a long time Democratic operative, working for CTCL, was alleged to have been given access to ballots and secured facilities.

This legislation would have allowed grant funding to be given to the Wisconsin Elections Commission, who would then disperse the money to all municipalities on a per capita basis.

Regardless of party or election, Wisconsinites deserve to know that their elections are safe and their votes count.

This bill would have provided a common-sense solutions to a real world problem that resulted in chaos and headaches.

Unfortunately, it will not be implemented.
